Winter Wonder



If you're getting married in the winter months there are still plenty of options you can always rely on. Roses are readily available all year round and make a timeless central flower.

Summer Stunners



Some flowers are more readily available in summer such as hydrangeas which pack a punch but are on the pricier side. Hydrangeas come in white, cream, pale blue and pale pink.

Wild Romantic



Prefer something looser? Go for a wild style with smaller blooms that work together to give impact. Smaller blooms can be more delicate and you need a lot more of them to make an impact. This style does allow more flexibility in specific flower choices which can help keep the full impact of the overall arrangement whilst sticking to budget.

Single Stems



You may be looking to keep it simple with a single type of flower in your bouquet. You could use a variety of flowers in a single stem style arrangement such as tulips (in spring) or roses.

Table Designs



Bud Vases

Approx. £12.50 per vase

A more cost effective option- small vases with a sample of flowers and foliage mirroring the flowers of the bridal party. For round tables choose an odd number- 3 or 5. For long tables- 2-3 per meter is a good approximation.



Low Urn

Approx. £80

Perfect for if you want a simple central arrangement. You could also alternate it you prefer- having some tables with low arrangements and others with high ones or bud vases.



Raised Centrepiece

Approx. £125

Raised above the table to that your guests can still see each other. This style of arrangement is immediately dramatic and gives the wow factor as soon as your guests arrive to your reception venue.



Long and Low- Top Table

Approx. £250 (5ft)

The price for this style would depend on the length required. A typical length would be 5 foot but smaller version would be easily achievable especially if you are having a sweetheart table for 2. One of the benefits of this kind of design is that it can be re-used: you can ask your venue to move it from the ceremony area to the top table.

Other items



Button hole

£10

Traditionally worn by the groom and groomsmen, buttonholes can also be worn by ushers and prominent male family members.



Bridesmaids' Bouquets

Approx. £60-£80

A smaller version of the bride's bouquet. Price will depend on size and if there are any specific blooms requested.



Flower Girl Mini-Bouquet

Approx. £20 - £40

A smaller version of the bride's bouquet. Price will depend on size and if there are any specific blooms requested.



Corsage

Approx. £15 - £20

Something for the important women who are not bridesmaids-mothers, grandmothers etc. Can be using ribbon to match the colour scheme of the wedding.



Flower Meadow

Approx. £150 -£200

Arrangements that sit flat on the ground. Often used to frame important locations such as welcome signs, the top table, ceremony table, the aisle etc. You can ask your venue to move these arrangements to different areas to get more use of them throughout your day. Price would mainly be determined by size.

How to Keep Costs Down

Expensive/Seasonal



Dahlia

Popular in late summer and most easily available July-September. Dahlias come in iconic 'pom pom' shapes and often create warmer or moody colour palettes. They are a pricey option- especially at the end of the season when a single stem can cost £3-4.



Peony

Soft and delicate with a subtle fragrance, peonies are infamous for their short season. Available May-June the window for peony weddings is very slim.



Ranunculus

Prices for ranunculus vary wildly but they are always limited by season. Though these dainty flowers (one of my absolute favourites) may not be too pricey they have a very short season and can require delicate wiring to keep them facing the right way.

Affordable/Available

Chrysanthemums

Chrysanthemums come in a large variety of colours, sizes and shapes. Some of them perfectly reflect the 'pom pom' shape of dahlias but the difference- they are available all year round and much more affordable!



Roses

Available all year round due to importing of flowers- roses make a timeless alternative to peonies. Some roses make quite a convincing duplicate of peonies such as garden rose varieties.



Lisianthus

Another one of my favourites- lisianthus is a little on the pricey side but with its many flowers per stem I personally think they are worth it. They come in a wide range of colours and you can get your hands on them all year around. Each stem typically has 3-5 flowers on it so they can be easily made into buttonholes and worked into all sorts of arrangements.



What is included?

Consultation and planning



We want to make sure that we are able to match your vision whilst also being mindful of budget and practical considerations. This involves a fair bit of planning, quotes, contact with your venue etc. In the original stages your plans and requirements may change several times- all of this can be accommodated at this point.

Ordering



Flower prices vary every day and when it comes to placing your order from our wholesalers we need to choose carefully to ensure that the quantity, colours, flower varieties and price all lines up.

Flower preparation (conditioning)



Flowers are delicate and need to be handled with care. We get your flowers delivered several days before your big day to ensure they are properly hydrated and at their optimal openness. This involves stripping off leaves and thorns, breaking down larger stems into more manageable pieces etc

Mechanics



This includes things you may not see such as the cost of twine, pins, ribbon, tape, floral foam etc. All of these items help to build your designs.

Delivery and installation



Bringing your arrangements to your venue or agreed location and also helping venue staff to secure them into place- this all takes time but is one of the best bits as I see how your vision comes to life.

Collection and cleaning



At the end of your day or the following morning I will return to your venue to take down your installations. The flowers are yours to keep but any vases, stands etc are hired to you (unless otherwise arranged) and I will collect these. If you would like me to start clear down slightly earlier and break down your arrangements into giftable bouquets please let me know and we can discuss this option (at cost of £50 for my time and extra materials).
